As of May 1st, we now offer free wi-fi in multiple areas at Mozingo Lake Recreation Park! Guests camping in RV Sites 1-95, lodging in the Family Cabins or hanging at The Point will now be able to access wi-fi on their mobile devices by searching for the 'Mozingo Guest' network and agreeing to the terms and conditions in their browser once it is selected. Wi-fi is no longer \$5 per day/device. Visitors will now be able to enjoy the beauty of our park and be able to stay in touch with the outside world.

5 Tips to Keep Your Campsite Free of Insects



1) **Keep your campsite clean.** It is by far the easiest way to avoid insects and other annoying pests such as raccoons and mice. Be sure to dispose of garbage, particularly food, and do not allow trash to accumulate on your site. Also, wash your cooking utensils well and assure all remaining food is returned to your cooler or pantry prior to turning in for the night.

2) **Avoid scented soaps, lotions, etc.** Body scent plays a huge role in how many bugs- particularly mosquitos - you may encounter while camping. When selecting toiletries to bring along, be sure to pack scentless items and avoid anything with a high fragrance. Rule of thumb- if it smells pleasant to you, it smells pleasant to them.

3) **Sage!** It isn't just good for cooking. Burning a small bundle of sage is a very natural and effective way of repelling insects. And as a bonus, it makes your campsite smell amazing!

4) **Go for a high and dry campsite!** We all love a good view of the lake, though the closer proximity you have to it, the more likely you will encounter insects. Bugs love moisture. Aim for a site at a higher elevation that is not close to wet or boggy portion of the lake.

5) **Choosing the right bug spray.** You will want something that has a sufficient amount of deet and is fairly water/sweat resistant. Be sure to reapply bug spray if it rinses off or if you notice an increase in bugs biting or pestering you

DIY Campfire Starters

There are several ways one can make campfire starters for the camping trips. However one of the simplest ones a person can make consist of egg cartons and charcoal. First, cut out each egg slot. The top portion of each slot is not needed, however can be burned if desired. Next, place one lump charcoal in each slot. And finally, place in the center of your wood stack and ignite. It's as simple as that! Pine cones and dryer lint also make good substitutions for charcoal.
